#### Modbury Allotment Association (MAA)

Before 2010, Modbury Parish Council was seeking a suitable site to use as allotments and a waiting list had been maintained if a site became available. Modbury Allotment Association came into being when Mrs Sylvia Mears and Modbury Parish Council signed an agreement for allotments to be permitted on the 0.74 acre field off Church Lane. The initial tenancy agreement, starting on the first of March 2010, was for 10 years and would be managed on behalf of the Parish Council by the MAA.

Plots on the field were marked out and plot holders were issued with tenancy agreements laying out the rules and regulations of tenure in keeping with MAA's constitution. From being just a grass field in the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) alongside Runaway Lane, the 14 plots were gradually developed into fully working allotments. The MAA installed two water troughs by digging the trenches that connected into Church Lane. Sylvia Mears made many visits and would sit on the benches at the top and bottom of the field, enjoying conversations with plot holders whilst taking in the peace and quiet of the field. Unfortunately, we lost Sylvia towards the end of our initial lease.

A further 5-year lease was granted by the Mears family and, for 13 full years of the established allotment site, MAA has grown into a strong community-based site, open for visits by anyone wishing to view the field. It is important to remember that not just 14 people have benefited, as the field is very much family orientated and many plot holders have come and gone. Classes at the school have visited, we regularly place fruit and vegetables outside the gate for the passing public when the crops are plentiful, and we support the annual May Fair Market with a popular plant stall that enables us to donate to the May Fair from the sales. Last year, we donated £100 thanks to our sales. Every year, plot holders support the annual Modbury Fruit and Produce Show, not only in fruit and produce categories, but in all other categories. We pride ourselves in these achievements.



This could be our last year of being able to use the Church Lane site, as we have been informed that the field will be put up for sale. This led to the designation of the field as a Community Asset to give the Parish Council time to formulate a bid to purchase the site. The designation of the field as a Community Asset means that there is a moratorium on the sale until April 2024 and, up until then, the field can only be purchased by a qualifying interest group, i.e., the Parish Council. A reasonable bid was made, but that bid was turned down, bringing us to the current situation. The Parish Council has since indicated that the asking price for the field is too high and they will not go any higher, however, the Parish Council bid remains 'on the table'.

The MAA Committee has decided to 'go it alone' in seeking to retain the allotment field. As the value put on the field is not achievable by the MAA alone, it is hoped that there could be benefactors who may be able to help us to secure the Church Lane site for Modbury in perpetuity. There may be somebody who wishes to purchase the site outright, where the rewards would be much greater than a small annual revenue, regular fruit and vegetables and as much horse manure as you wish to take! Is there anybody out there wishing to own a field with a great community, that keeps on giving, and who might like their name on the gate? ## Modbury Parish Council Meeting

#### Tuesday 5th March 2024, 7.00 pm at the MARS Pavilion, Queen Elizabeth II Recreation Field.

MODBURY PARISH COUNCIL

Present were all eight councillors, Bernard Taylor (SHDC), and 17 members of the public.

#### Council Actions since the last meeting

- MARS work continues on setting up the charitable trust for the QEII Recreation Ground.
- MPC will be moving to new office premises at 1 Modbury Court, Church Street, on 2<sup>nd</sup> April.
- MPC attended the Allotment Association AGM. The allotment land is now officially for sale, but at a cost too high to be viable for the community; alternative sites for the allotments are under consideration.
- Cllr Barbara Price has joined The Modbury Sick Poor Charity as MPC representative.
- The Maintenance Committee is surveying the Modbury footpaths and has advertised, with some success already, for new volunteers and a co-ordinator.
- The Road Warden's team have filled in many potholes after the roadworks traffic has receded and drains have been cleared.
- Modbury Litter Pickers have resumed work and collected a lot of rubbish.
- MPC building assets have been surveyed for insurance valuations.
- A new picnic bench has been installed in Champernowne, and a replacement memorial bench has been purchased by a parishioner for the road to Aylestone Cross.
- The Modbury's Marvellous Makeover meeting was held with many positive suggestions. These are being collated, and budget and action plans are being drawn up. The last two weekends in April are targeted for community action.

The application by Richard Foss to join the Council as a co-opted member was accepted.

#### Public Forum:

Baker Estates presented on their planning application for the housing development at Penn Parks. This was in response to the concerns raised at the MPC meeting on the subject on 17<sup>th</sup> February. The two major issues raised were pedestrian access and a proposed reduction in social housing from the statutory 30% to 10%, ie 4 houses. Baker Estates stated that they could not guarantee to use the green lane, Drovers' Way, so had submitted plans with pedestrian access to the school and town centre crossing the main road, A379, twice as well as various minor roads. They alleged that the reduction in social housing was due to increased building costs, unforeseen development issues and associated costs, and severe downward pressure on house prices. There was no support from either Council members or the public for the position taken by Baker Estates.

#### SHDC Report:

- There are grants available for parish infrastructure.
- Awards are available for outstanding local community volunteers.
- Vouchers to help with energy costs are available through Citizens Advice.
- It was pointed out that there has still been no action on the flooded and damaged road at Orcheton. Bernard Taylor committed to attend a meeting of stakeholders arranged by Cllr Ann Turner.

#### Minutes of Meetings of 6th February and 19th February 2024 were approved.

Matters arising:

- The telephone box in Poundwell Meadow is now owned by MPC and uses are being considered.
- A strategic plan has been written and needs finalising in a further council meeting.

**Planning:** Three planning applications were considered, of which two were supported and one, the Penn Parks development, was rejected.

The decision of SHDC to approve the application for residential accommodation in the New Mills Industrial Estate was noted; MPC expressed concerns about this decision and will raise them with SHDC.

#### Policy:

- A business owner at Palm Cross proposed that to alleviate parking issues for his clients he purchase 8-10 spaces outside his unit. It was considered that we cannot sell the spaces as they are a Council asset, primarily for residents. There are currently 4 spaces available for rent which he can take when we are satisfied that no more are required by residents. We are aware that the business owner is doing his best to inform his clients of the parking issues.
- The formation of a planning committee was considered. It was agreed to form one to consider the detail of any applications and then make recommendations to the full Council.
- The lease for the new office at 1 Modbury Court was approved.

**Highways:** The report on pedestrian safety in the Parish, commissioned by the Maintenance Committee from the highways consultants, Callidus, was considered. This is a detailed report and needs to be further considered so that the various options (potentially 14 schemes) are properly ranked and costed.

#### Sustainability:

- Provisional Tree Protection Orders have been granted along Cottlass/Kennel Lane; these will now be open for consultation.
- Palm Cross hedge will be reinstated with mixed native hedging, a joint initiative with MODWAG.
- A thermal imaging camera is on 14-day loan from SHDC to check building energy efficiency and is available for use.

A Royal Charter to hold an annual nine-day Fair was granted to Modbury in 1329 by King Edward III. The Charter was read by the Portreeve on May 3rd, eve of the old St. George's Day, to announce the start of the Fair and allowed that the people had the right to free trade and to sell liquor without a licence. This freedom was symbolized by the Glove, which, on a pole with flowers, was first hung on the Market Hall, then the Bell Inn on Broad Street. The Town Crier reads the Charter and the Glove is hung there on the same building every year.

Modbury's own Town Crier, David Scott, will officiate and herald events throughout the Fair.





#### The Curator

Modbury's high street needs to be thriving with all premises occupied, so it was very good news when the Little Kitchen, which had only opened intermittently, was taken over by the Curator last autumn. This is already a popular venue, so I called in for a coffee and chat with Matteo Lamaro, who with his wife, Sarah, owns and runs the business. They already run two Curator coffee houses in Totnes, and their expansion to Modbury intrigued me.

Matteo and Sarah have lived in Modbury since 2011 with their two boys, Edo & Bertie, who attend Modbury School; indeed living close to them over the years, we have noticed in the past many secret goings-on for the school at their house, making floats for the Modbury May Fair parade and more. It made sense to open in Modbury, Matteo told me, so when the Bistro/Little Kitchen premises became available, they decided to take the opportunity to expand here.

Matteo is Italian, Sarah from Yorkshire, and they met in Romania in 1996 where both were doing voluntary work for a charity in Bucharest. They then lived in London, both working in child & adolescent mental health services and education. Due to the recession, Matteo was made redundant and decided to try running his own business in London. His brother already had a bakery business in Italy, making Italian cakes and other specialities,





so Matteo decided to import these from him and open a business retailing them. His stalls at local markets became very popular. When they moved to Devon, Matteo continued in this type of business selling his wares at local markets in Exeter, Kingsbridge and Totnes. In 2011, his market stall was on the pavement outside the (now) Totnes Curator, when the then owner approached him telling Matteo that he was looking for someone to rent the Curator premises. This was a areat opportunity for the Lamaros and they opened a coffee bar on the ground floor, gradually expanding upstairs to include a restaurant. Matteo is a qualified chef and loves cooking, so this arrangement suited him well. The owner of the premises was a professional fashion photographer for Vogue, and helped the Lamaros style the premises. They opened in May 2012, during the Totnes Olympic Festival on the day that the Olympic torch was carried through Totnes and right past the Curator. This was shortly after the Totnes community had voted to prevent a Costa coffee bar from opening there, and Matteo was interviewed about this by the Guardian!

The term Curator is defined as a person in charge of a place where objects of art, science, or items of interest from the past are collected. Looking around the Curator in Modbury, I couldn't help thinking that the name suits these very neat, artfully decorated premises. At the Curator they roast their own coffee beans in Totnes over an oak or ash fire, using only artisan beans, currently from Uganda. They only use beans which are quality rated over 80/100, and only buy beans from small specific growers, which they sell, as well as blending them



to create the Curator House blend. This is very important to the Lamaros, who donate  $\pounds 1$  from every kilogram of Ugandan beans they sell, back to these artisan bean plantations, many of them locally run charities. The Curator is very eco-conscious, using only their branded coffee mugs and cups, plus paper compostable cups. They can also provide recycled returnable plastic cups at  $\pounds 3$ , which they then wash and replace each time one is brought in to be refilled. If you bring it back and don't want to keep it, you get a free coffee as a thank you.

The Modbury Curator has two airy rooms, each with chairs and small round tables, so it is not designed for large groups to meet, but fine for couples or small groups. Plans are afoot for a covered outdoor area, with bicycle parking in the wide entrance alleyway, as apparently quite a few cyclists call in when passing.





Sarah mostly manages the accounts, payroll, human resources, and front of house training. I was certainly welcomed when I arrived, and the Curator has a very friendly feel about it. Sarah is adamant that they could not do anything without the support of their amazing team in both Modbury and Totnes, many of whom have been with them for years helping the business to grow. As Matteo enjoys cooking, they have started the Curator Supper Club, a monthly evening three course Italian set meal, on a Thursday in Modbury and a Friday in Totnes. These are in two sittings, 5.45 pm and 8.30 pm with artisan wine produced by a small Italian vineyard and explained by a sommelier friend of the Lamaros. Boony and I have just experienced our first one as I write, and thoroughly enjoyed the evening, food and wine.

### Call for volunteers – Parish Paths Partnership (P3)

Public Footpath

Many of us make regular use of, and enjoy, the extensive network of public paths and other rights of way around the parish. They are some of the joys of living in a rural area and provide an opportunity to walk dogs, commune with MOP nature or simply enjoy exercise away from our busy roads.



Following the retirement of Brian Weeks as our local P3 Liaison Coordinator (thank you again Brian for the sterling work you have undertaken over the last 23 years) and the resignation of his team of volunteer helpers, we currently have no one to undertake the much-valued work of maintaining our path network. We are therefore looking to recruit a new coordinator and volunteers willing to undertake simple maintenance work.

The local network is actually the responsibility of Devon County Council as the Highway Authority and the county's Public Rights of Way Warden and Parish Paths Liaison Officer provide a link to individual parishes which, like Modbury, sign up to the Parish Paths Partnership (P3) scheme. Under the scheme, parishes commit to undertaking an annual survey of footpath condition, proposing improvement schemes for the county to fund and carrying out simple maintenance to keep the network accessible to the public. Around half of all parishes in Devon are signed up to the scheme.





### An Apothecral Tail Hiems



We are past the shortest day and approaching the coldest point of winter. Already there are encouraging signs of better things to come. In December, the daffodils bloomed at Silverwell. There are occasional sightings of primroses, lesser celandines and Devon violets. However, the plant that I am currently interested in is Alexanders (Smyrnium olusatrum).

Alexanders are generally considered to have been introduced to Britain by the Romans; another example of "What did the Romans do for us?" (including, of course, the introduction of the Modbury tradition of refuse collections on Fridays!). The Romans ate Alexanders and took them with them on journeys.

The name "Smyrnium" comes from the Greek word for myrrh, whilst the word "olusatum" was the Roman name

for a plant from the Latin "olus" meaning "herb" and "ater" meaning "black". The English "Alexanders" is a corruption of olus ater and has nothing to do with Alexander the Great. Numerous common names include allsander, alshinder, alick, skit, skeet, heal root, megweed, wild parsley, Macedonian celery, wild celery and horse celery.

It was originally a coastal plant but now grows pretty much everywhere, especially road sides. This inland spread may be due to the salting of roads. It was commonly grown as a pot herb until inexplicably being replaced by celery in the 19th century. All parts of the plant are edible. The black seeds can be ground as an alternative to pepper.

The use of Alexanders has mainly been as a food source. Medicinally it has been recommended, since ancient times, chiefly to aid digestion. Parkinson (1640) described the preparation of **Lenten Pottage** eaten during Lent and made from Alexanders, watercress and nettles. It was claimed to sharpen the appetite and to counteract "viscous humours from overconsumption of fish". Sailors valued Alexanders for "clearing the blood" (probably due to its vitamin C content to counteract scurvy). This was so valued that ships docked in Anglesey just to collect Alexanders.

Alexanders contain **isofuranodiene** which is being investigated as a possible anti-cancer drug and to treat liver damage.
