





Blue tit, great tit, coal tit, long tailed tit, chaffinch, bullfinch, greenfinch, goldfinch, pied wagtail, robin, house sparrow, dunnock, blackbird, moorhen, goldcrest, song thrush, starling, meadow pipit, wood pigeon, collared dove, pheasant, stonechat, buzzard, sparrowhawk, crow, jackdaw, rook, magpie, jay, barn owl, greater spotted woodpecker, lesser spotted woodpecker, mute swan, Canada goose, Egyptian goose, mallard, egret and herring gull.

I will give an update in a couple of months, with hopefully some warm weather arrivals and those others that have stayed in the warm and kept snuggled in their nests – yes, jenny wren, that's you I'm talking about.

Readers may recall that Modbury Parish Council is planning to replace the unsafe adventure trail at the Memorial Hall with a new recycled plastic, long-life, low-maintenance alternative.



We are pleased to announce that we have given a contract for this work to Rhino Play Ltd of Ipplepen, Devon. They aim to start work on 17 February with completion by 6 March 2025, although, in reality, it is likely to complete well before the latter date.

Unfortunately, this means the upper play area will have to close for a time, but we will work with the contractor to minimise the impact and duration of the works.

The project is being part-financed by the Rural England Prosperity Fund and we thank South Hams District Council for supporting our bid.



### **Modbury Parish Council Meeting**

### Tuesday 14th January 2025, 7pm



Present were seven councillors, Cllr Bernard Taylor (South Hams DC), Cllr Rufus Gilbert (Devon CC) and three members of the public. Apologies were received from Cllr Sarah Wyatt (MPC).

#### **Public Forum**

- A member of the public from Orcheton raised the flooding issues there. Cllr Ann Turner confirmed that a full meeting will take place on 21st March with all of the relevant parties involved, including our MP.
- It was noted that there is an issue with potholes in Church Lane. Cllr Phil Smith pointed out that the road condition is a consequence of the diversions put in place during South West Water works. DCC Highways will be approached to do a proper 'patching' job on that road.

### **Devon County Council Report by Rufus Gilbert**

- There is extra Government money (£86m) available for Devon Highways for permanent road mending and clearing drains.
- At the recycling depots, 79% of all deposits are recycled, which is a relatively high figure.
- The Government White Paper on devolution is out. In Devon, that would involve the dissolution of all local government to reduce the number of levels. There would be a single tier new authority. Town and Parish Councils will not be affected. DCC have agreed to proceed. Plymouth has applied to retain its unitary status. A decision is expected by the end of January 2025 on delaying this summer's planned elections.

### South Hams District Council Report by Bernard Taylor

- The bottle bank at California Cross has been removed because of commercial users.
- There are various community awards in progress (young persons, community champion, community organisation, climate and diversity champion) and nominations are encouraged via the SHDC website (South Hams Community Awards page) before the end of February or contact Bernard Taylor direct.
- Changes to parking charges are in progress, details to be released.

### Extraordinary General Meeting held 19th December 2024

This was for replacement equipment in the Memorial Hall Play Area. SHDC gave a grant to cover a large part of the cost (report on p.3 by Cllr Phil Smith).

### **Finance**

The budget for 2025-2026 was proposed by the Finance & HR Committee. There will be a £5,000 deficit which needs to be covered by reserves, as well as a 5% rise in the Parish Council precept.

### Planning

The decision made by SHDC to refuse the planning application for Cottlass Lane/Kennel Lane was noted.

### Highways and Maintenance Update

- The Road Warden scheme covers various works on highways within the Parish, including mending potholes on non-A roads. The current warden has resigned, crucially over the use of private vehicles and the associated insurance implications. This is also an issue for the P3 Co-ordinator. DCC have not been appraised of this issue before and will investigate.
- LiveWest have done their hedge cutting, but work still remains.
- The Church Lane allotments have been purchased by local benefactor, David Scott, who will transfer them to a trust for community and church benefit, for which the Parish Council are very grateful (report on p.12).
- The recent storms meant that the emergency plan was implemented to oversee flood and wind issues. Some problems were discovered during this process which mean that we need to update the plan and contact details, along with training on actions required. DCC and SHDC will support improvements to the plan.

#### Sustainability

- The next meeting of the Sustainability Group will be on the 3<sup>rd</sup> February.
- There are ongoing projects in the churchyard with planting, wildlife surveys and educational talks.
- Palm Cross hedging will be maintained in the Spring.
- The next Naturefest is planned for the 28th June.
- Grants for sustainable energy are being sought for community buildings.

Date of next meeting: Tuesday 4th February 2025.



CHRISTIAN COMMENT: As I write this it is the beginning of January and my family and I have been discussing the coming year. I have resolved to be better at communicating and to reply to emails and messages sooner!

Perhaps you have made your own resolutions; losing weight or reading more. In addition, there are no end of tips for 2025 e.g. "10 top tips for being the best version of yourself in 2025," "5 top tax saving tips for 2025," "25 easy health tips to transform your life in 2025" and so on.

But if we are truly honest, trying to comprehend a whole year ahead is a task that may be too large when some of us may only just manage a month or a week at a time. Perhaps, even, one day at a time is a struggle for you. And that is before we even begin to try make our way through any lists or bullet points. Lists and tips and resolutions can become, for some of us, an exhausting, heavy weight.

It is the striking, opposite-ness of the Christian faith that the Living God does not demand "self" improvement, but rather he sees how we fall short at *all* our attempts of meaningful improvement even as we do not like, and may stubbornly refuse, to admit it. But he offers instead to be our strength and give us purpose for life that is easy to bear:

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. ... For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (Matt 11:28, 30)

This year, why not step away from the pressures of 'being better' and find true satisfaction by faith in the one who is "the most excellent of men" The Lord Jesus Christ?



### MODBURY ALLOTMENT ASSOCIATION (MAA) - NEW PROGRESS

As regular readers of the monthly publication "Modbury Messenger" may recall, in the April 2024 copy, the front page was devoted to the Community Asset Allotments in Church Lane and the field, known as Sylvia's Field, which was being put up for sale. The Parish Council made valiant attempts to raise money, but a change of Government resulted in no grant being available and so with another buyer needed to come forward, I offered for several reasons.

Firstly, as Town Crier, I took charge of the formal opening on Saturday 13 March 2010, with various persons in attendance – Rev. Neil Barker, who asked for God's blessing, and Mrs Sylvia Mears, who had made an agreement with the Parish Council, were present together with members of both the Modbury Society and the History Society, as well as the Modbury Chamber of Commerce and the first Chairman of the Modbury Allotment Association, Mr Tim Smith. My introduction cry is on p.21 of this Modbury Messenger.

Secondly, I had known Sylvia's Field when it was used as a pony field and I further knew that Modbury needed allotments and was pleased to be involved at the start of the Church Lane project.

Thirdly, I was sad that there was a move to investigate more possible housing development and so I sold some of my capital and together with the legal help from my solicitor – who incidentally is the new Postmistress of Modbury Post Office, Mrs Jenny Jones of Devon Law - I put in a bid to buy Sylvia's Field, to keep this land as a Community Asset and retain the Allotments, which has been accepted.

Thus, my future intention is to form a Trust, which will be established with all the Allotment holders paying rent and ensuring that the daily running of the site is maintained. All profits will then be paid into a restricted St George's Church Fabric Fund to assist in ensuring that Modbury Church is maintained as both Sylvia Mears and I would want.



- 1. Please note that if the wind is above 20 knots the intended flag hoists will not take place.
- 2. The intended flag hoists will not take place if the Modbury Chief Yeoman is absent.
- 3. All the signal hoists are done using the various Country/National Ensigns and the International Code of Signals Flags.
- 4. Starboard Yardarm (Plymouth)-West will have the event wording, (which sometimes is abbreviated only 7 or 8 flags can be flown).
- 5. Port Yardarm (Modbury)-East will have the year. Answer Pennant (Ans) will indicate the start (when at the top) or end (when at the bottom).
- 6.  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$ ,  $3^{rd}$  substitute flags will be used whenever a flag flown earlier/higher in the hoist is to be repeated. e.g.  $2022 = 2,0,1^{st}$ sub,  $3^{rd}$ sub.
- 7. If there is a significant event which does take place, additional signal flag hoists will be arranged, subject to the note 1 above.
- 8. However, all the above flag hoists are subject to change.
- 9. The flag hoists will only use the International Code of Signal Flags, which can be found at:

### **Recycling Electricals**

This is the first of two articles which have been written for the Holbeton Parish Climate Change sub committee and are published in the Environment Tips section of the Holbeton Newsletter.

**WHAT are 'electricals'?** Very broadly, they include any appliances which use electricity to make everyday life easier and/or more enjoyable: toasters, kettles, washing machines, televisions, also electronic devices which rely on software for all sorts of communication and information management.

### WHY is recycling them so important?

Whatever their purpose, it is becoming increasingly important to reclaim and recycle them all, firstly for their **Value** and secondly, especially with batteries, for their **Safety.** 

Most electricals are made of non-renewable materials like metal and plastics. Unlike many plastics, the metals can be re-cycled to make other things. For example, the steel in one domestic iron can be used to make 13 tin cans, 95% of which are made of steel.

Electronic devices also contain precious metals such as gold, platinum, lithium and cadmium. If we are going to continue depending on these, it is vital we re-use them. If we just dump them in the 'grey' bins, these rapidly vanishing resources will end up being incinerated and lost forever.

### WHERE does electrical waste go?

South Hams nearest recycling centre is just outside Ivybridge. It is open 7 days a week. The Material Focus website also lists other places where waste electricals are accepted.

The Small Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) legislation requires producers to recycle their end-of-life products. As long as they sell similar equipment, retailers are also obliged to offer to take back unwanted electricals for recycling, whether or not they have been purchased in their shops. But, for the moment, they are mainly collected in lyybridge.

WEEE materials are sent to specialist recycling companies across the country. Ivybridge send their materials to an international company, SIMS Recycling, at their Nottingham scrap yard where they are repaired and/or recycled.

Electronic devices, like laptops or mobile phones, are an exception, because they may have value in themselves. If owners give explicit permission, viable devices will be serviced and either donated to charities like the Salvation Army, or sold on at low prices in the site shop, helping to fund developments at the centre.

We have been assured that no waste material of any sort is sent overseas.

Tips: Recycle only if it is impossible to re-use electricals. Recycling them is good for the environment and for the economy. See the Material Focus website (address below)

### WHO is responsible?

The Recycling Centre is managed by SUEZ Recycling, but Devon County Council owns the site, holds the contracts, monitors service delivery and holds the company to account.

### HOW can we get more information?

Material Focus (https://www.materialfocus.org.uk/) is the name of a campaign set up in 2020 to encourage people to recycle the old cabling, chargers, laptops and mobiles which lurk in those 'Drawers of Doom' which inhabit many homes.



Pray silence for the first Chairman of Modbury Allotment Association, Mr Tim Smith.


